Campamento CURLA Rain Forest Bird Hike

\$30 per person

For guests interested in a more casual outing than the Pico Bonito rainforest hike or who wish to do a second rainforest hike, The Lodge at Pico Bonito offers a full morning of birding "Campamento CURLA", a private and scenic rainforest preserve which adjoins Pico Bonito National Park and which is managed by one of Honduras' national universities as a study and research area.

After a twenty minute drive east of The Lodge, taking us south and into the scenic Rio Bonito valley, we follow a well established dirt two track road, birding our way through open areas and mixed habitats before entering the lush primary forest which comprises the Park's nuclear zone. Easy to moderate walking (and excellent views) produces highly diverse sightings. A typical morning visit to this area could yield the following:

Barred Antshrike, Russet Antshrike, Dot-winged Antwren, Ochre-bellied Flycatcher, Rufous Piha, White-collared Manakin, White-eyed Vireo, Red-eyed Vireo, Long-billed Gnatwren, Tropical Gnatcatcher, Spot-breasted Wren, Golden-winged Warbler, Magnolia Warbler, Chestnut-sided Warbler, Yellow Warbler, Black-throated Green Warbler, Black and White Warbler, Kentucky Warbler, Red-throated Ant Tanager, White-winged Tanager, White-shouldered Tanager, Summer Tanager, Golden-hooded Tanager, Green Honeycreeper, Shining Honeycreeper, White-collared Seedeater, Yellow-faced Grassquit, Pale-billed Woodpecker, Lineated Woodpecker, Olivaceous Piculet, Black-cheeked Woodpecker, Turquoise-browed Motmot, Blue-crowned Motmot, Black-throated Trogon, Black-headed Trogon, Slaty-tailed Trogon, White-bellied Emerald, Violet-headed Hummingbird, Purple-crowned Fairy, Violet Sabrewing, White-crowned Parrot, Red-ored Parrot, White Hawk, Bat Falcon, Spectacled Foliage Gleaner, Buff-throated Foliage Gleaner and Black-faced Grosbeak.
